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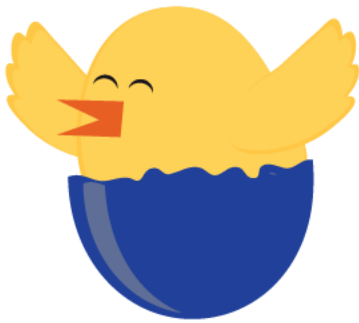
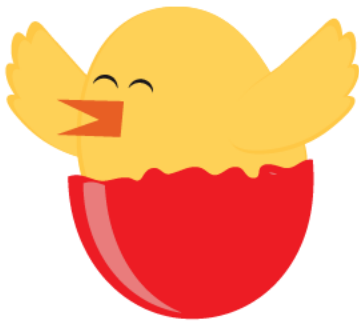
Egg Shell Color Matching v.1

Cut out the cards below. Then have your child match the correct color egg shell top to the chick in the egg.



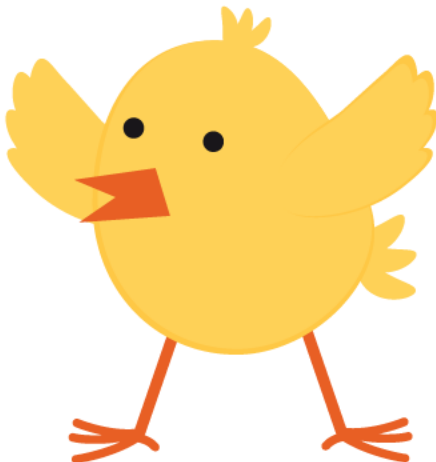
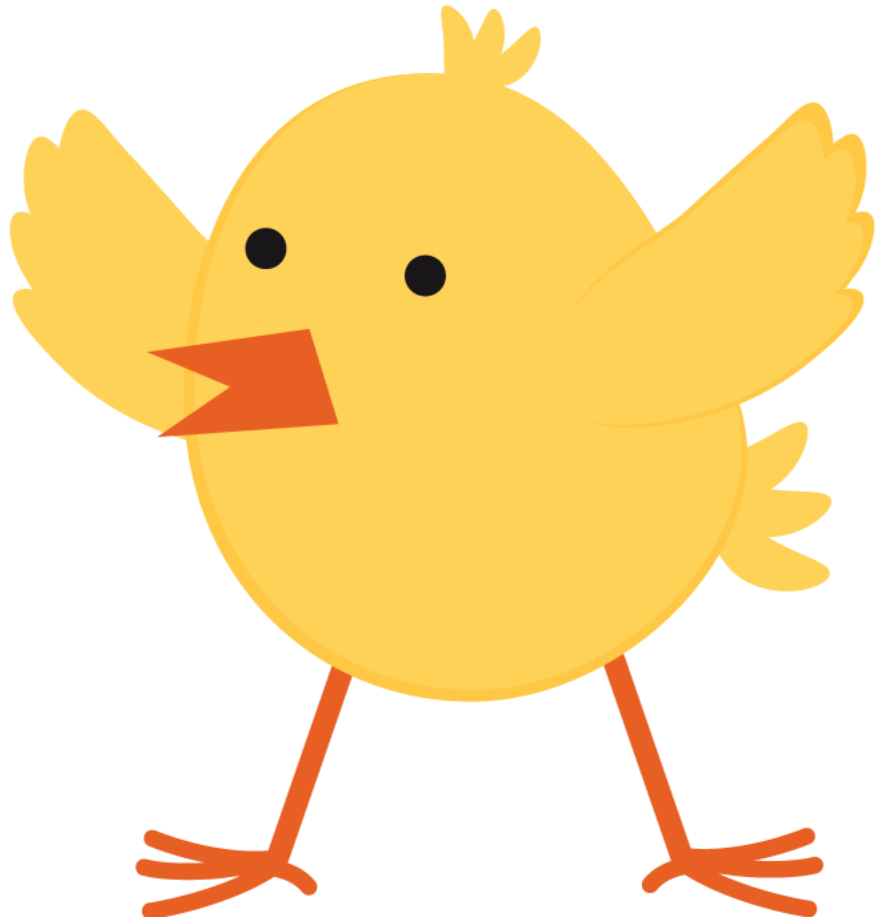
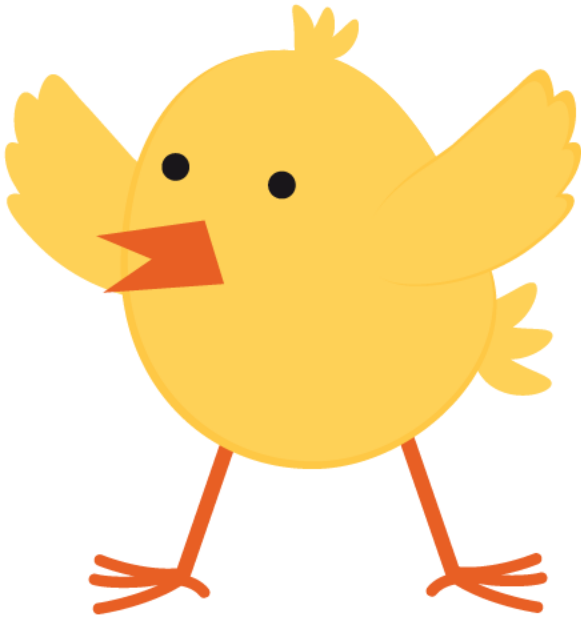
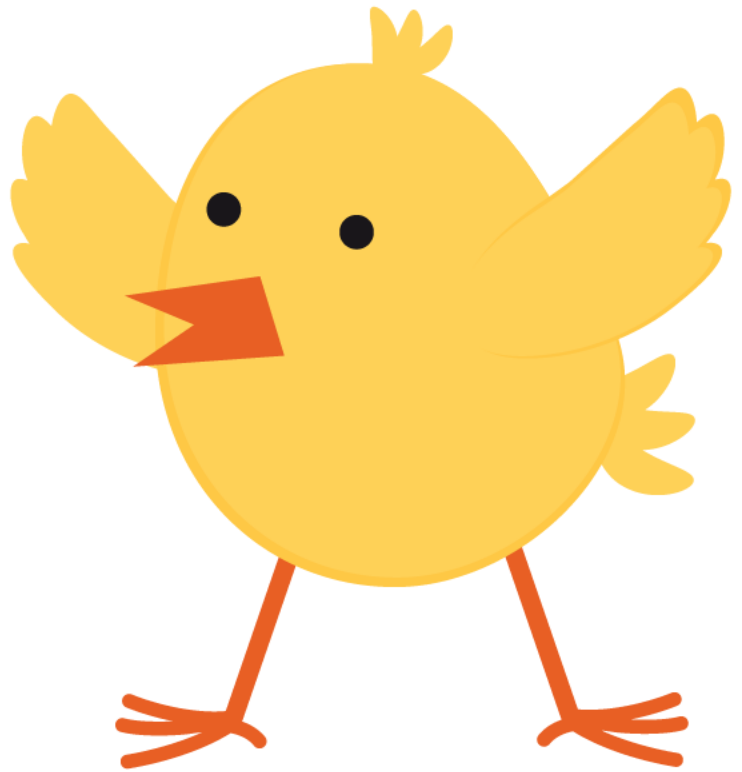
Egg Shell Color Matching v.2

Draw a line from each chicken to the egg shell top that matches the one the chick is sitting in.



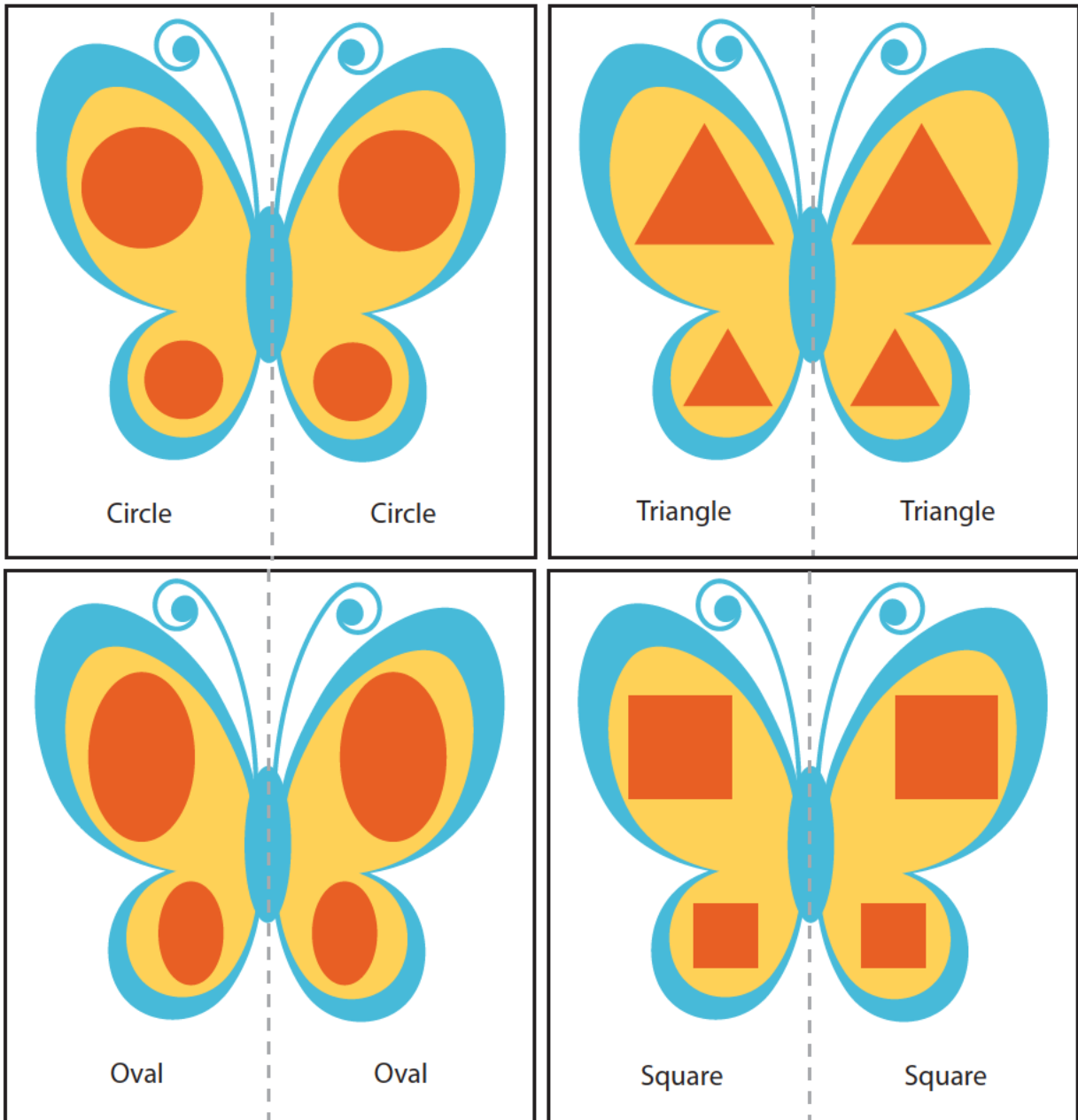

Butterfly Shape Matching

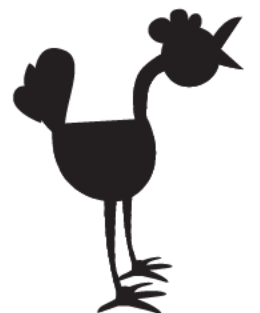
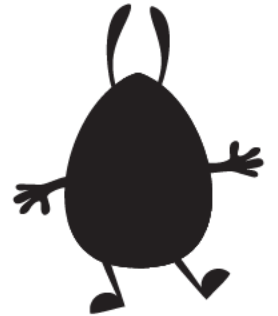
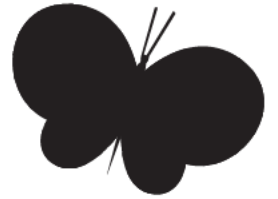

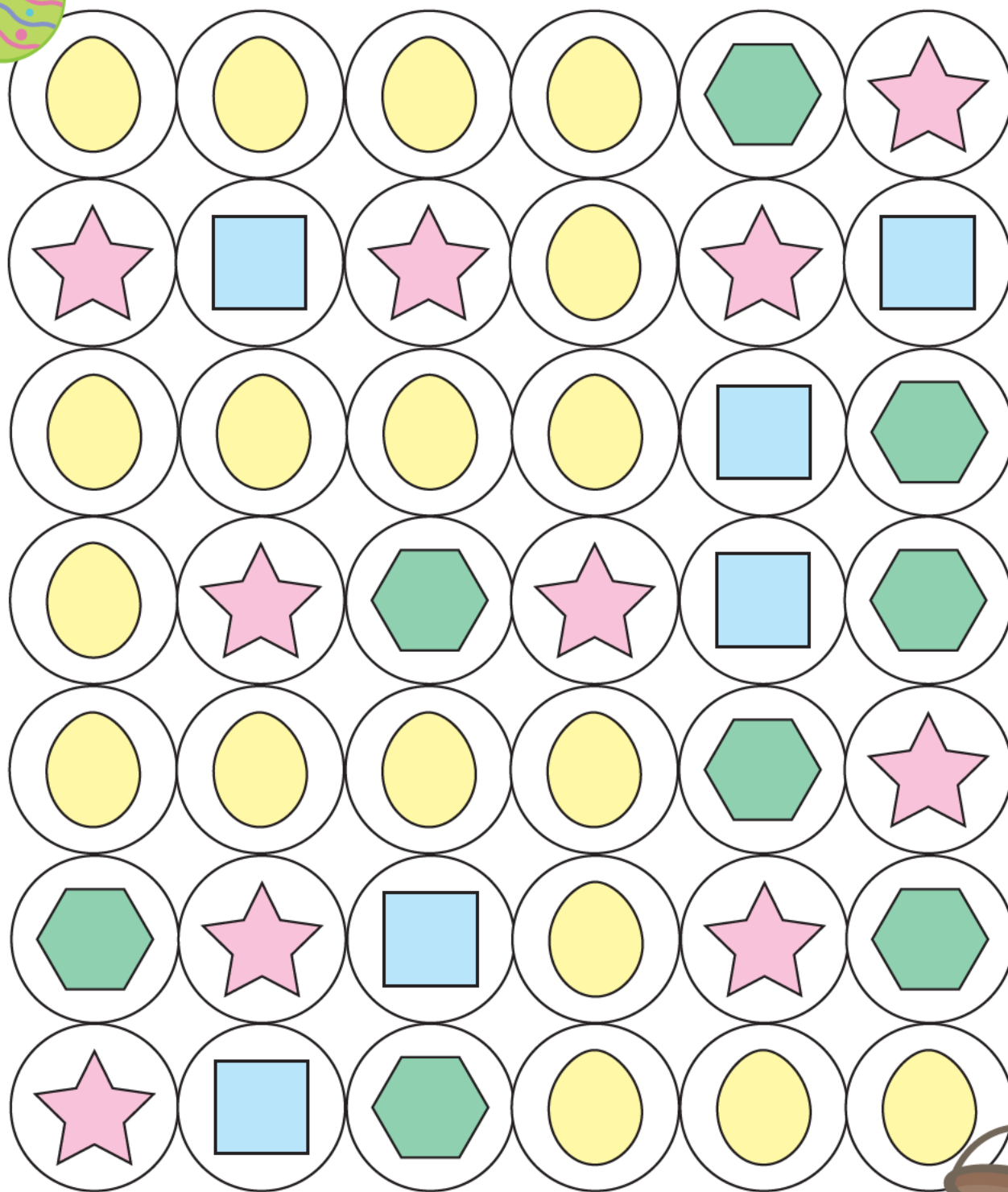
Shadow Matching

Match each animal on the left to its shadow on the right.



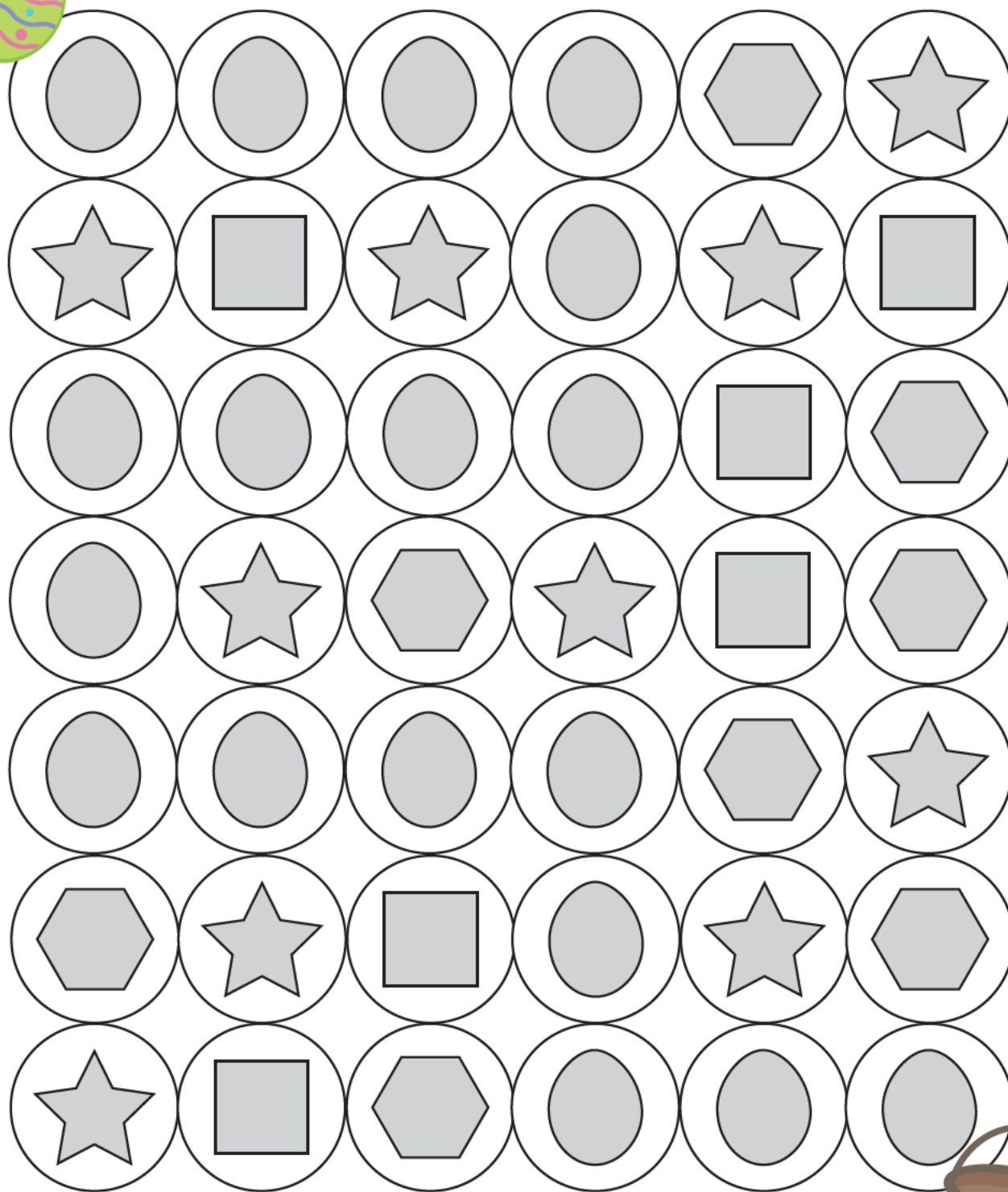

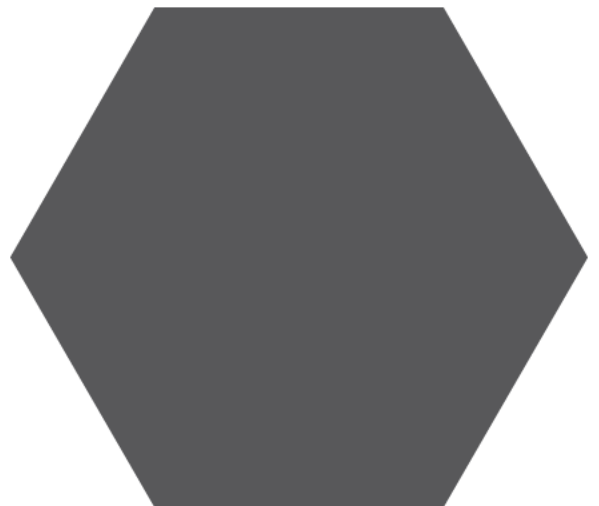
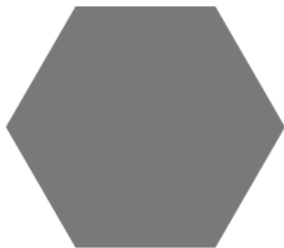
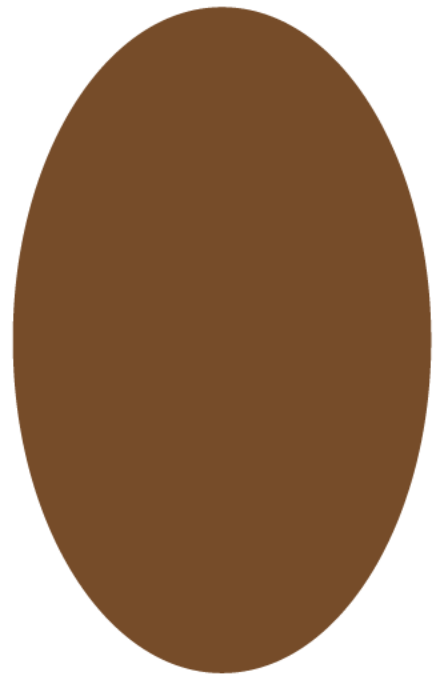
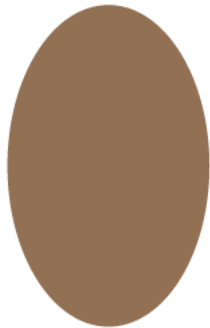
Easter Shapes and Sizes

Easter Sorting Activity

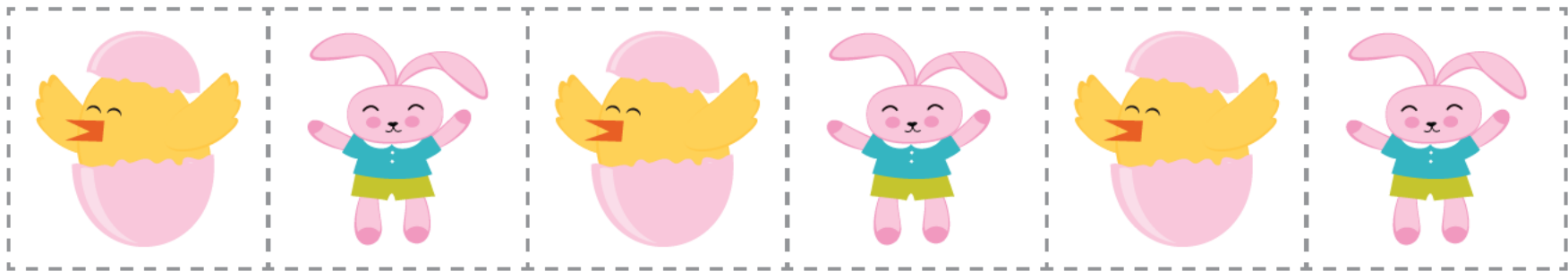
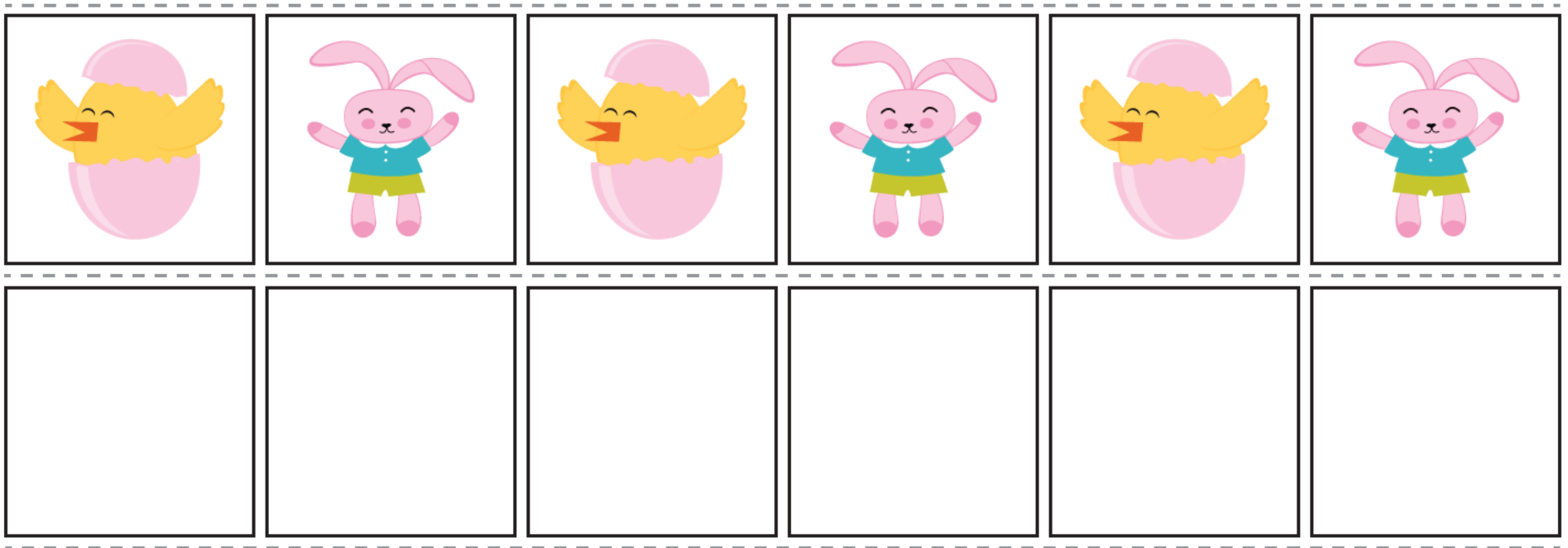

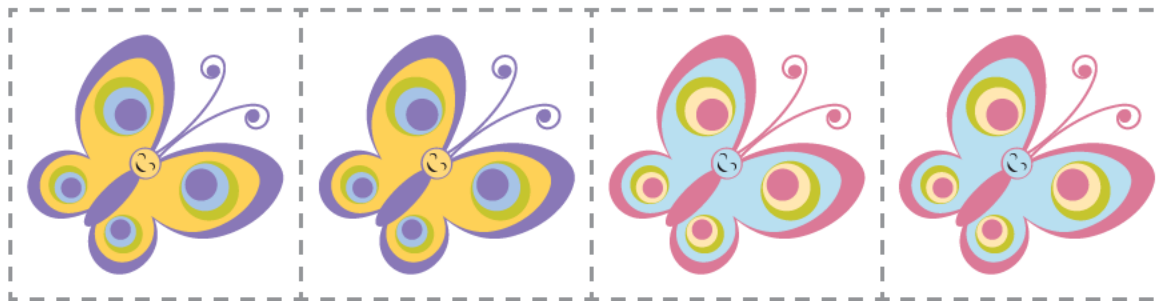
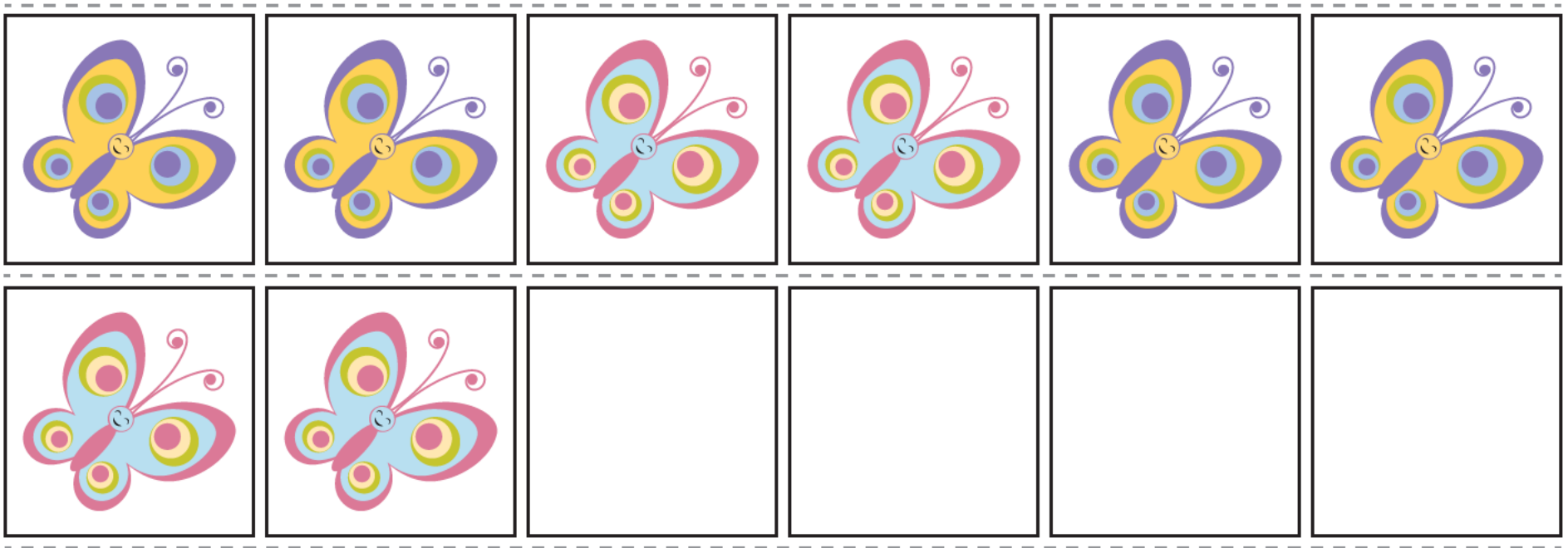
Easter Patterning Activity - ABAB

- (1) Cut out all items along the dashed lines. This will leave you with two rows of boxes and six individual shapes in boxes.
- (2) Tape the two rows together so that the boxes with items inside are on the left and the empty boxes are on the right.
- (3) Have your child place the individual shapes into the empty boxes, following the ABAB pattern.



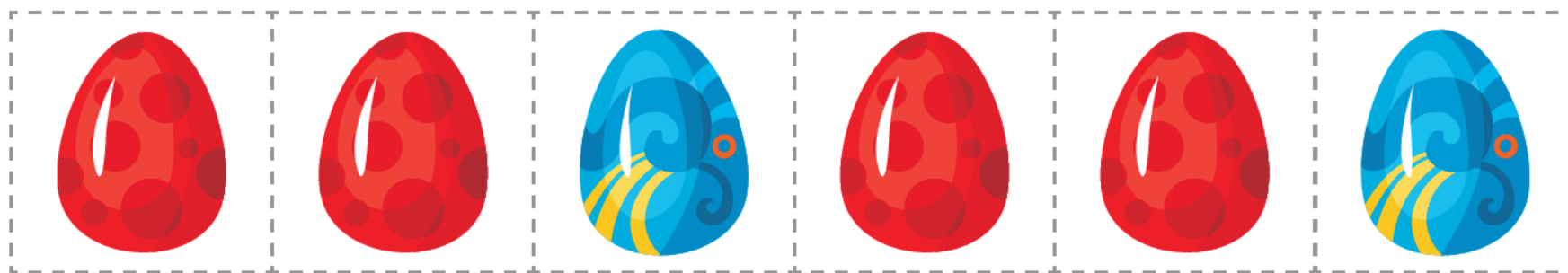
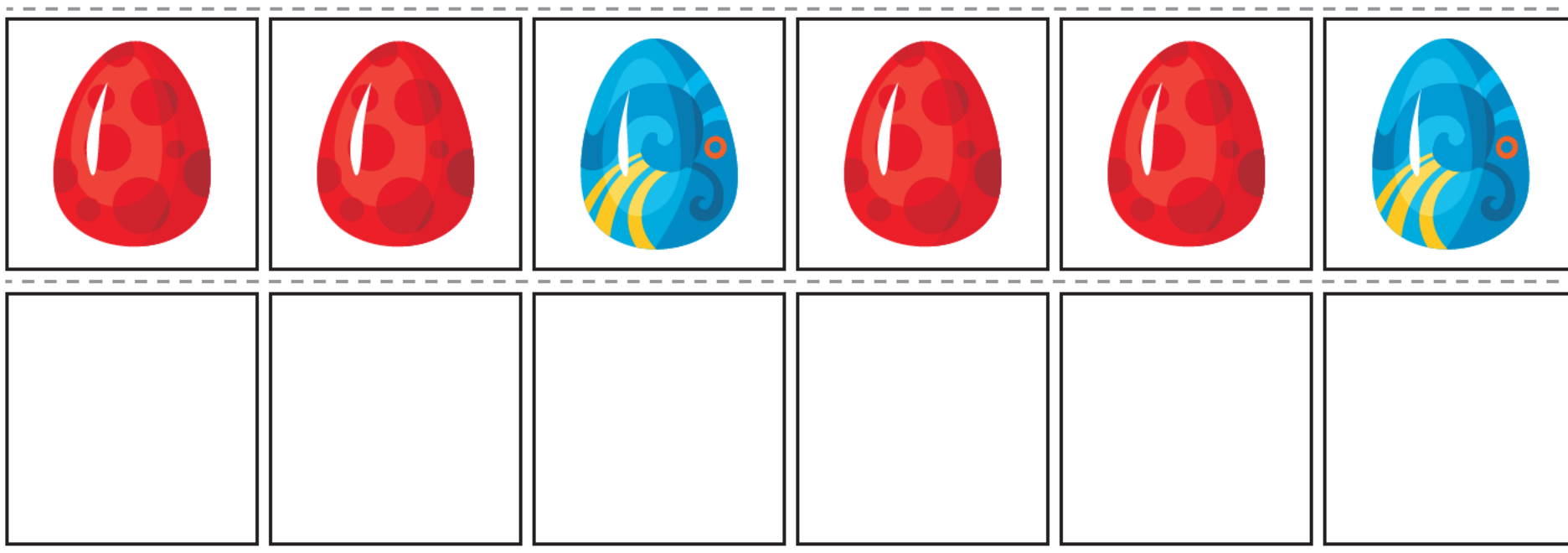
Easter Patterning Activity - AABB

- (1) Cut out all items along the dashed lines. This will leave you with two rows of boxes and four individual shapes in boxes.
- (2) Tape the two rows together so that the boxes with items inside are on the left and the empty boxes are on the right.
- (3) Have your child place the individual shapes into the empty boxes, following the ABBB pattern.



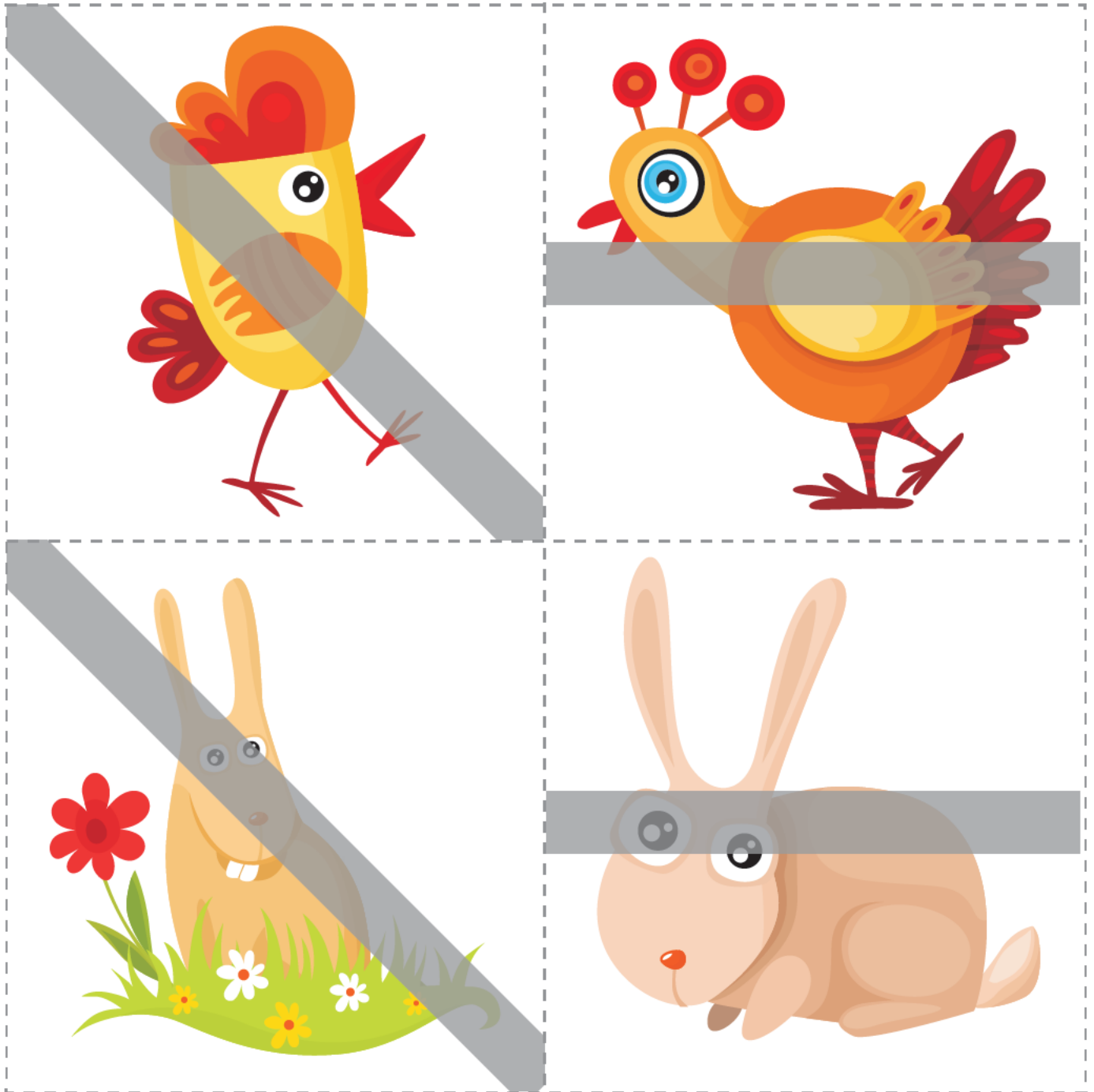
Easter Patterning Activity - AABAAB

- (3) Have your child place the individual shapes into the empty boxes following the AABAAB pattern.



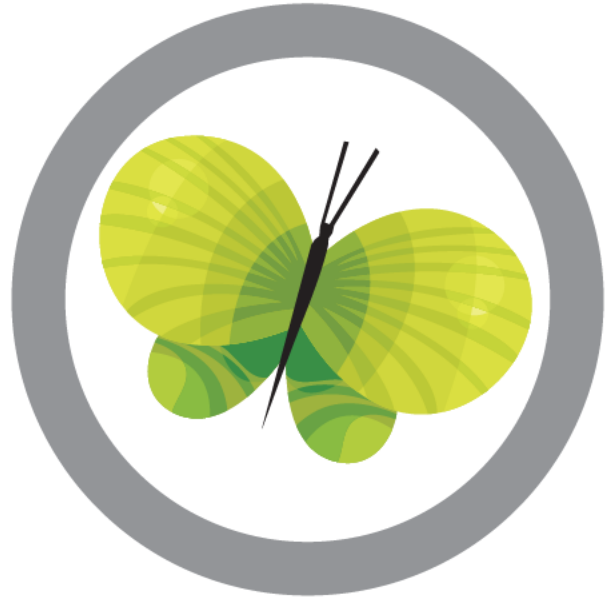

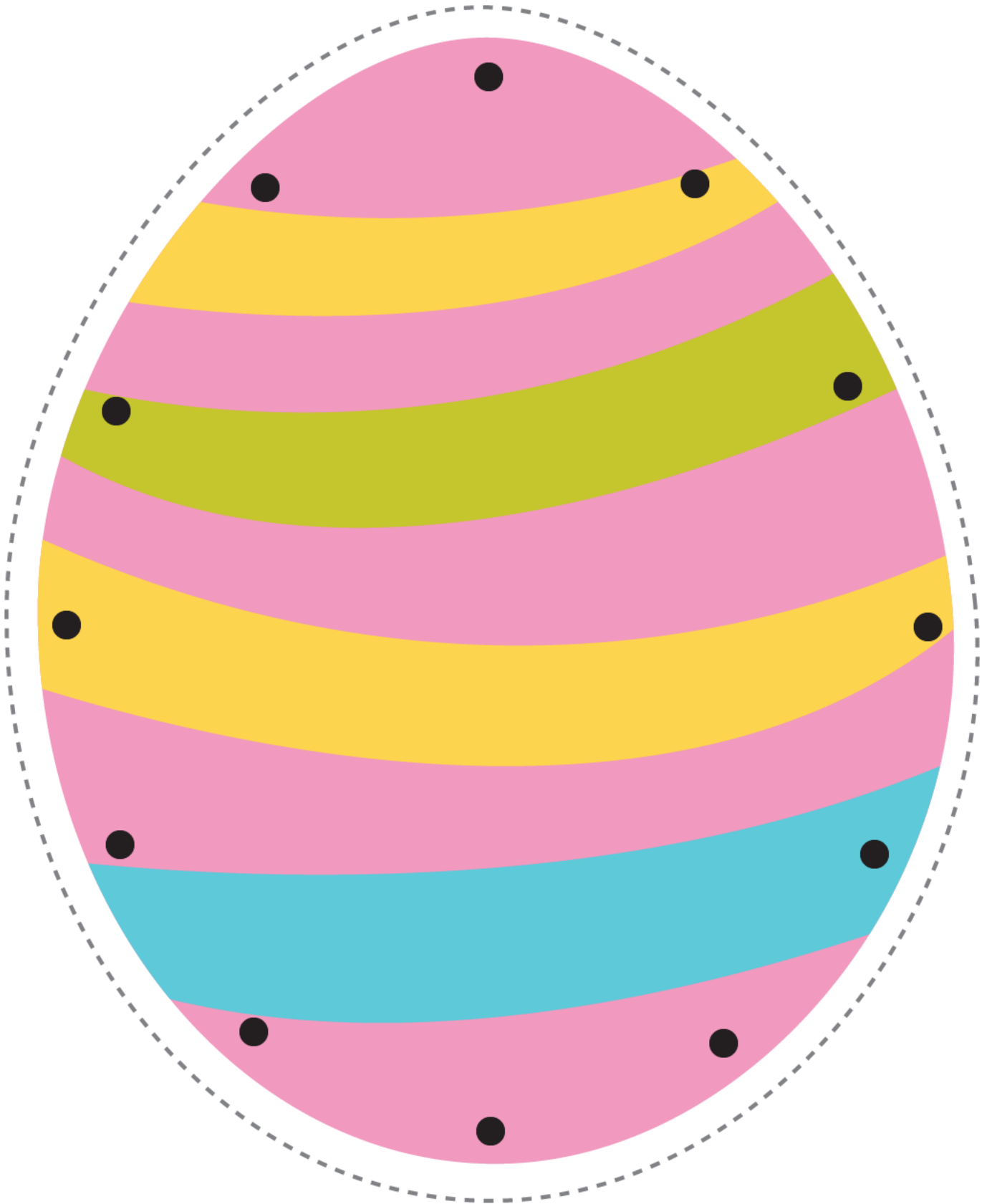

Cut out the pictures along the dotted lines. Then have your child cut each picture along the thick grey line.



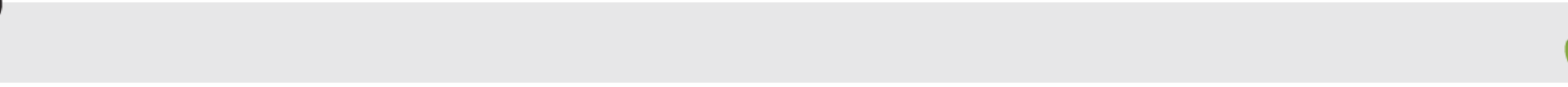
Easter Egg Lacing Card

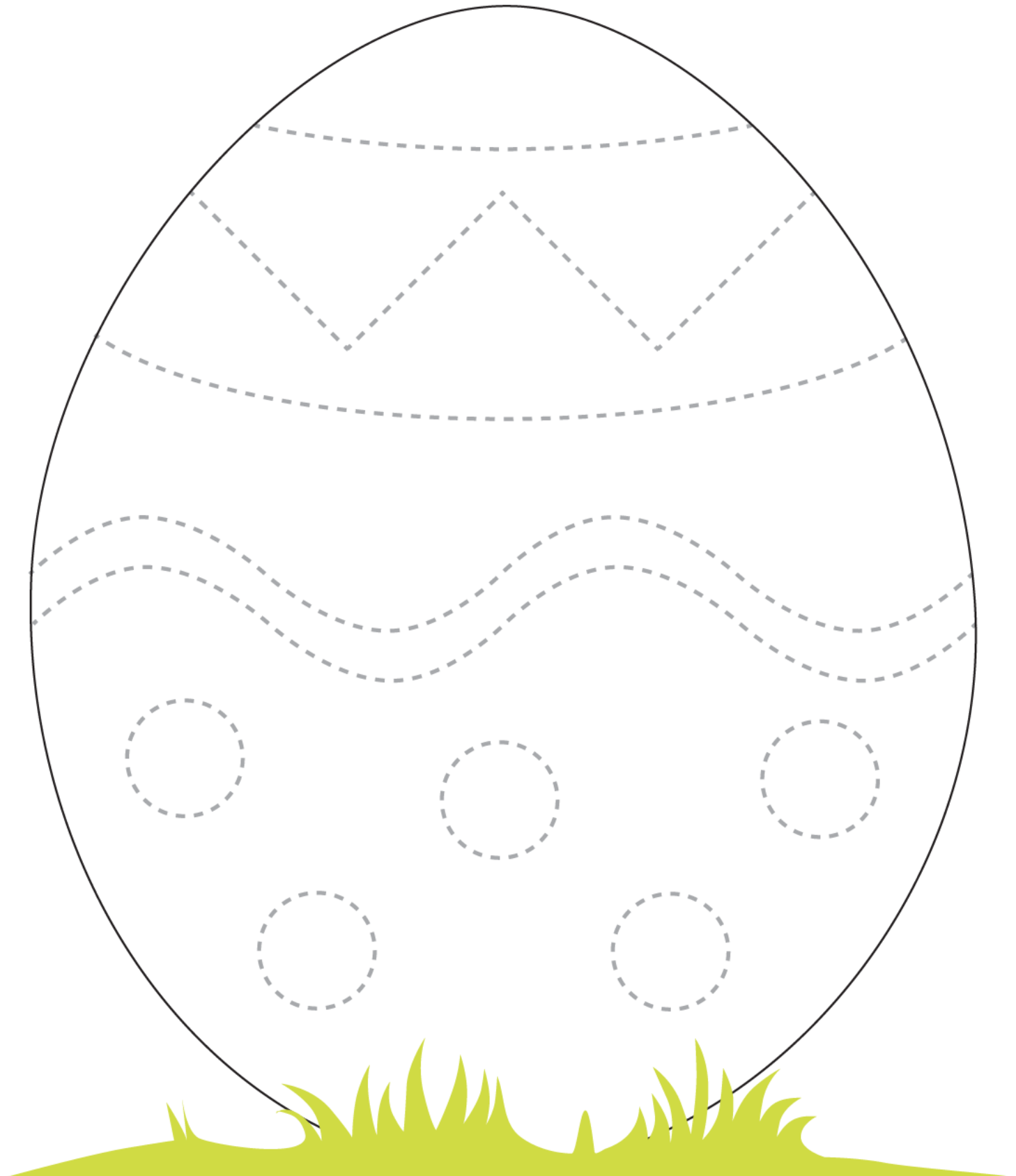
Easter Pre-Writing Practice

Using a crayon or marker, trace the lines to help the bee find the flower for Easter.



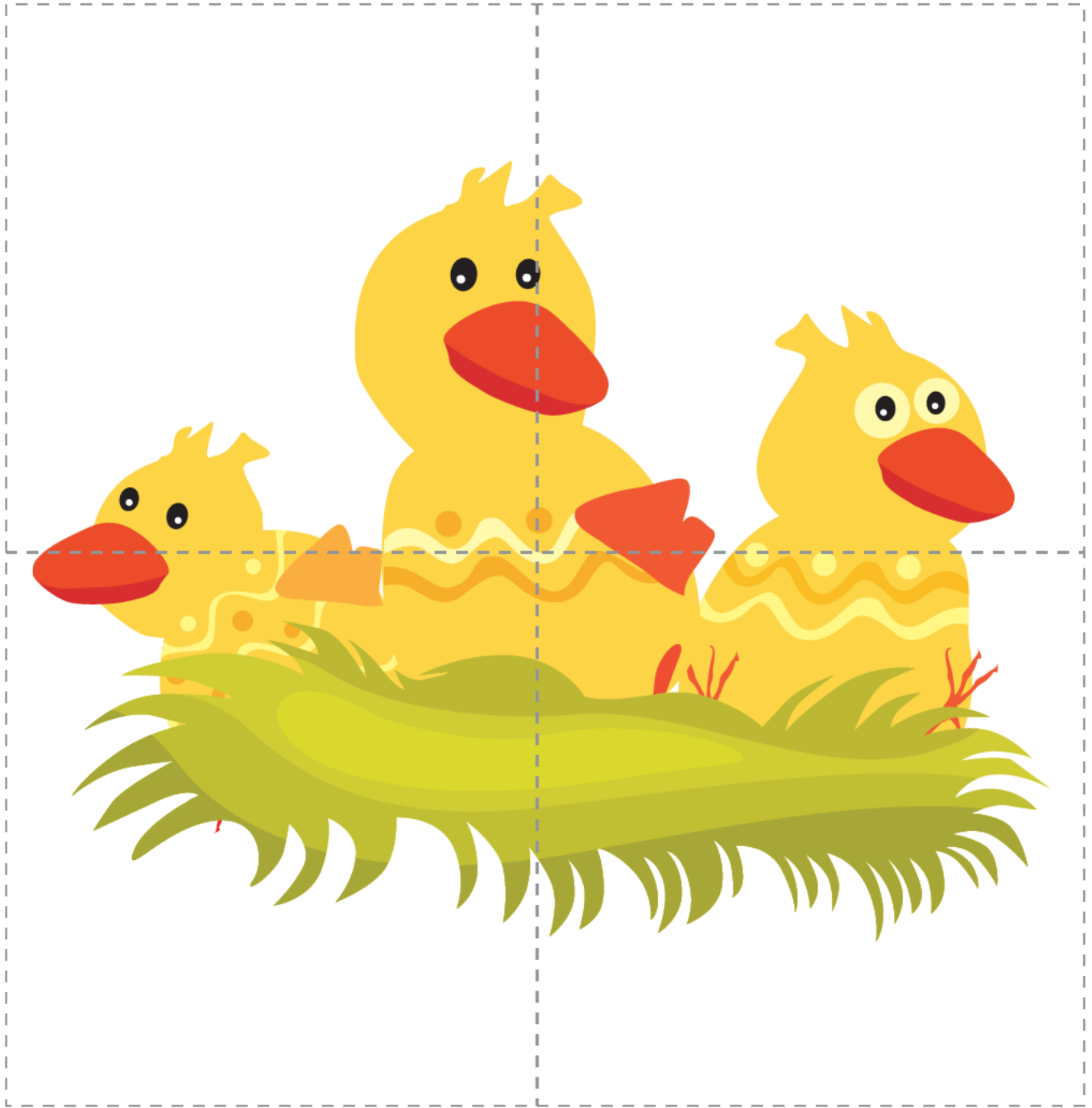
Trace the Lines on the Easter Egg

Using a crayon or marker, trace the dotted lines to add some design to your Easter egg.



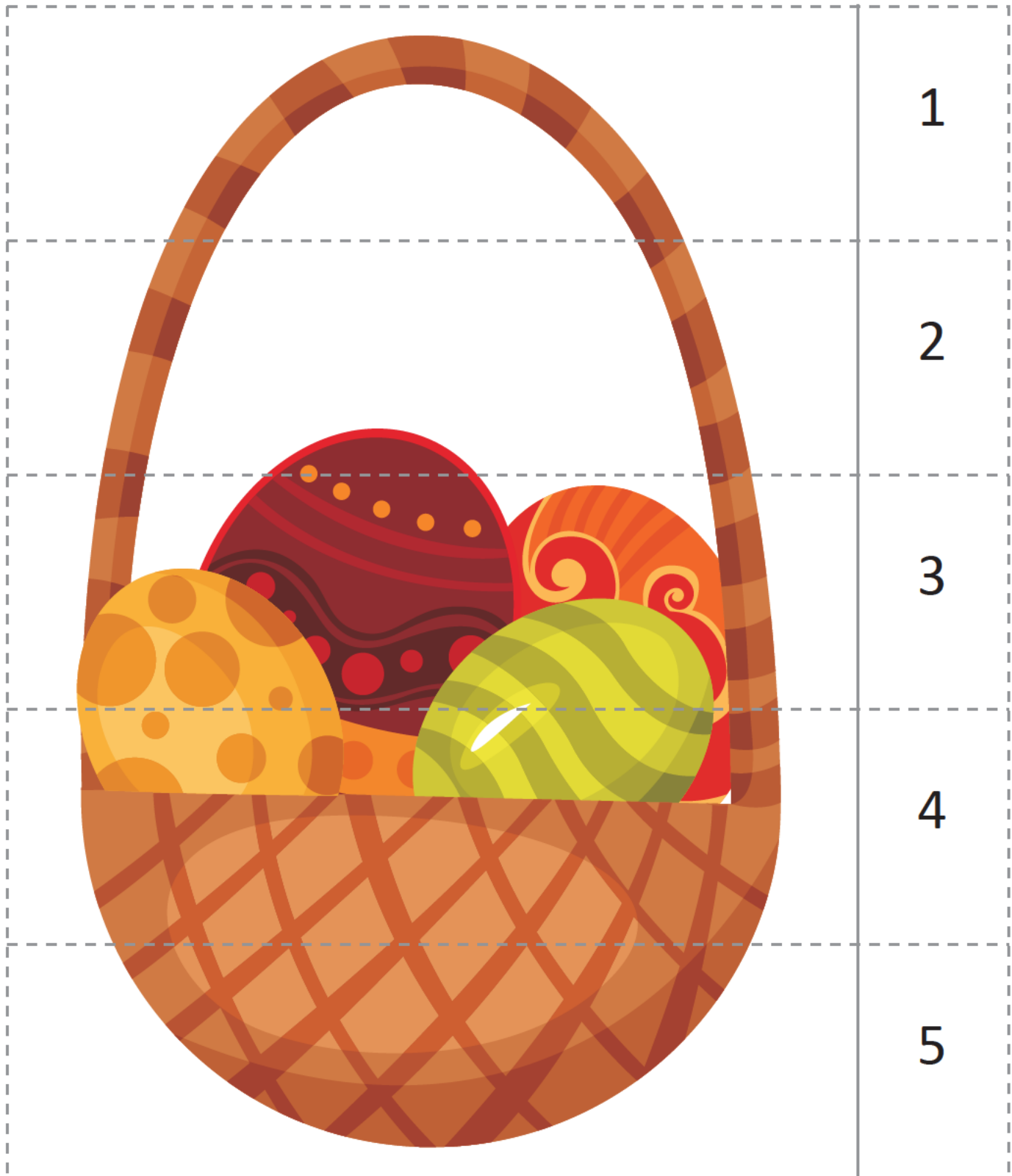
Easter Puzzle v.1

Cut the puzzle pieces on the dotted lines. Then have your child assemble the puzzle.



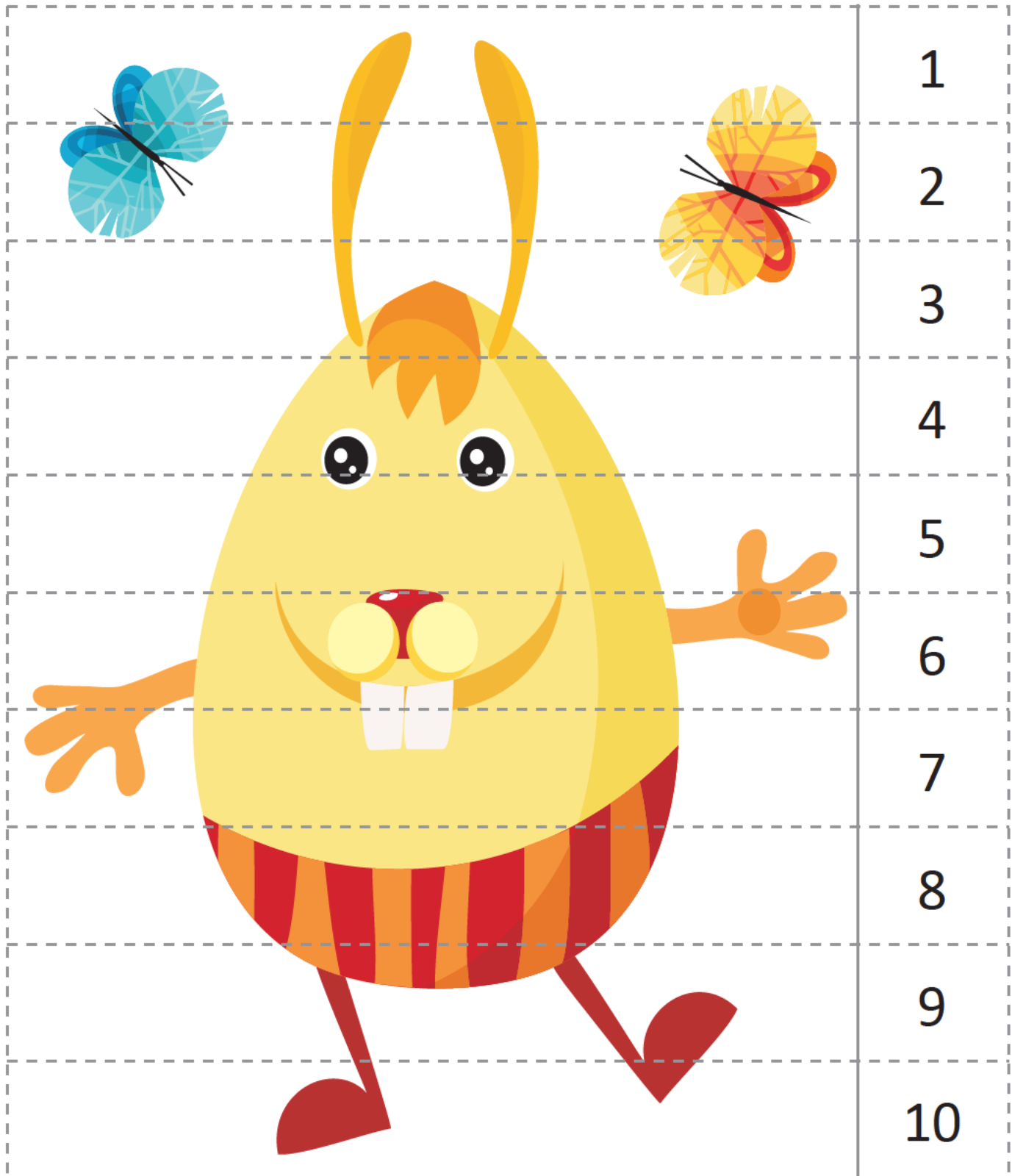

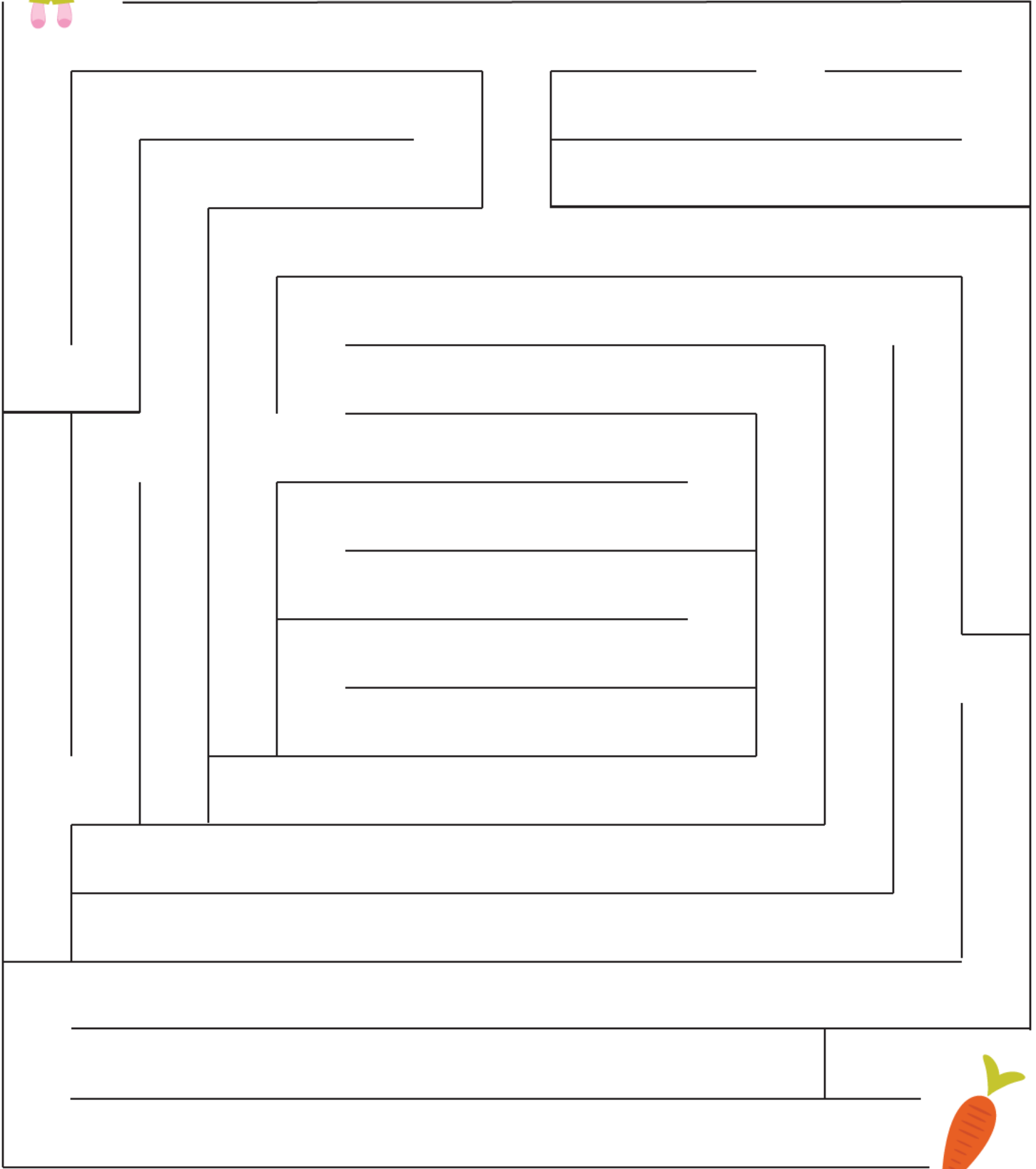
Help the Bunny Find the Carrot v.1

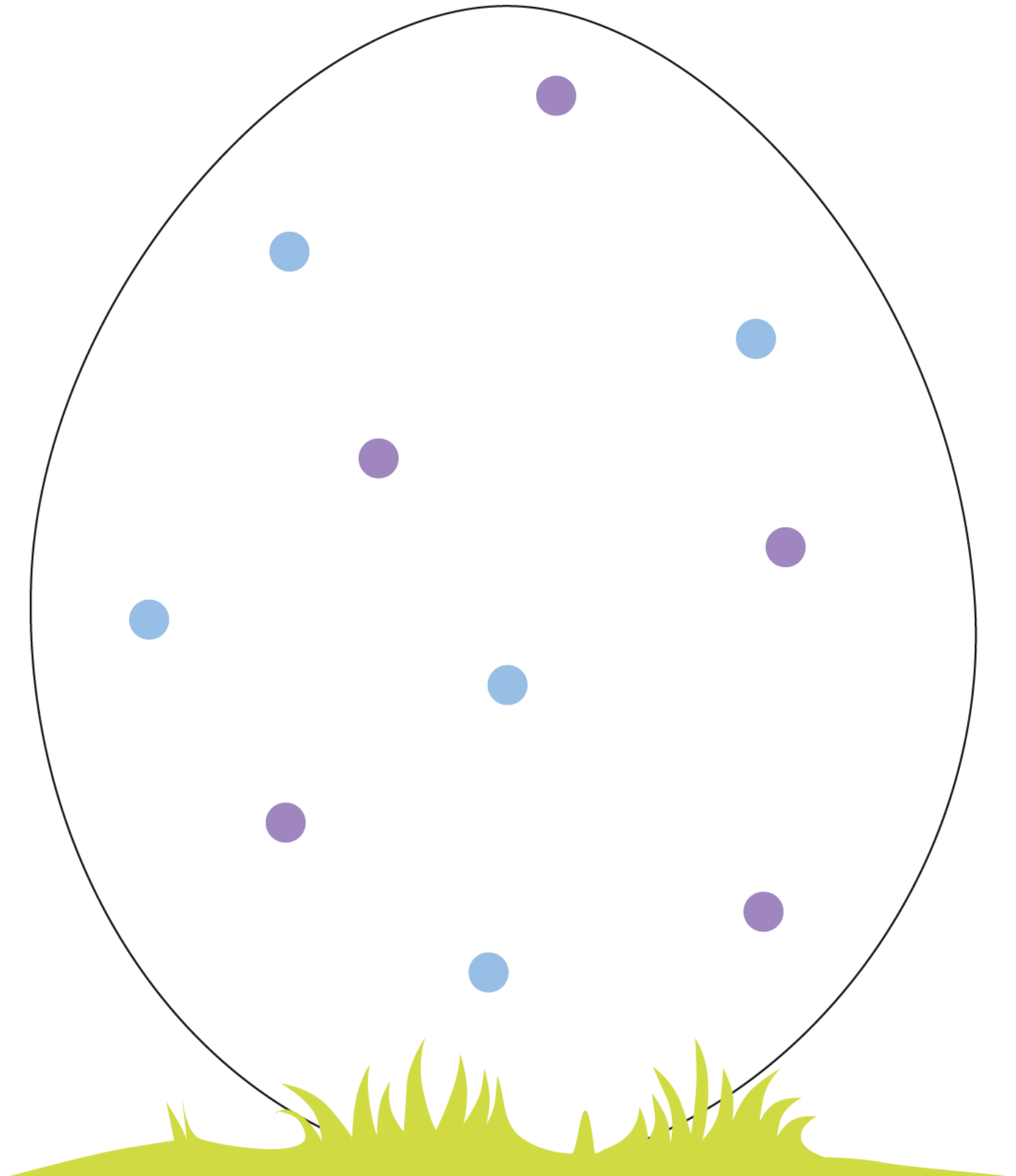

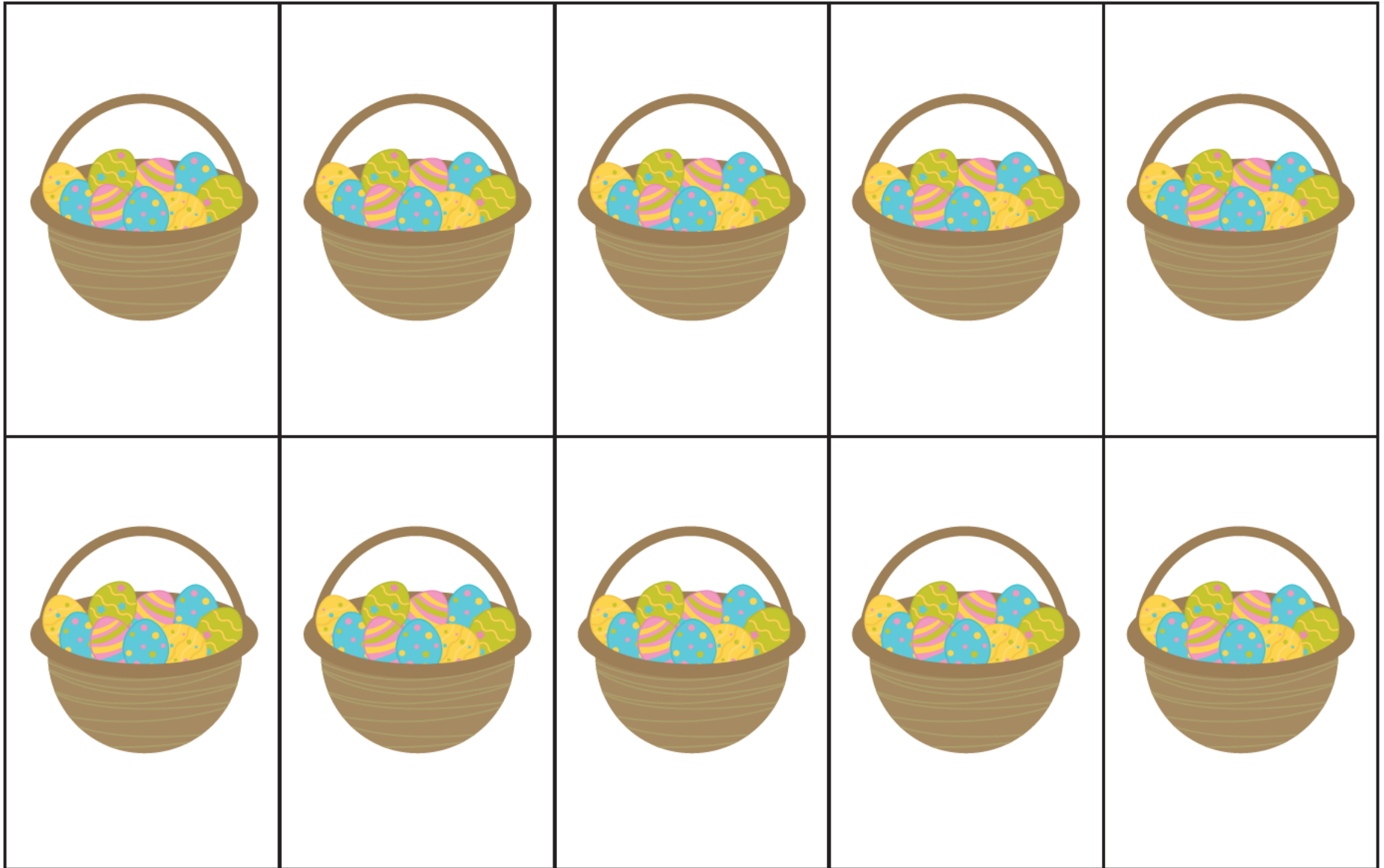
Easter Egg One-to-One Correspondence

Place one sticker on each of the dots to practice one-to-one correspondence.



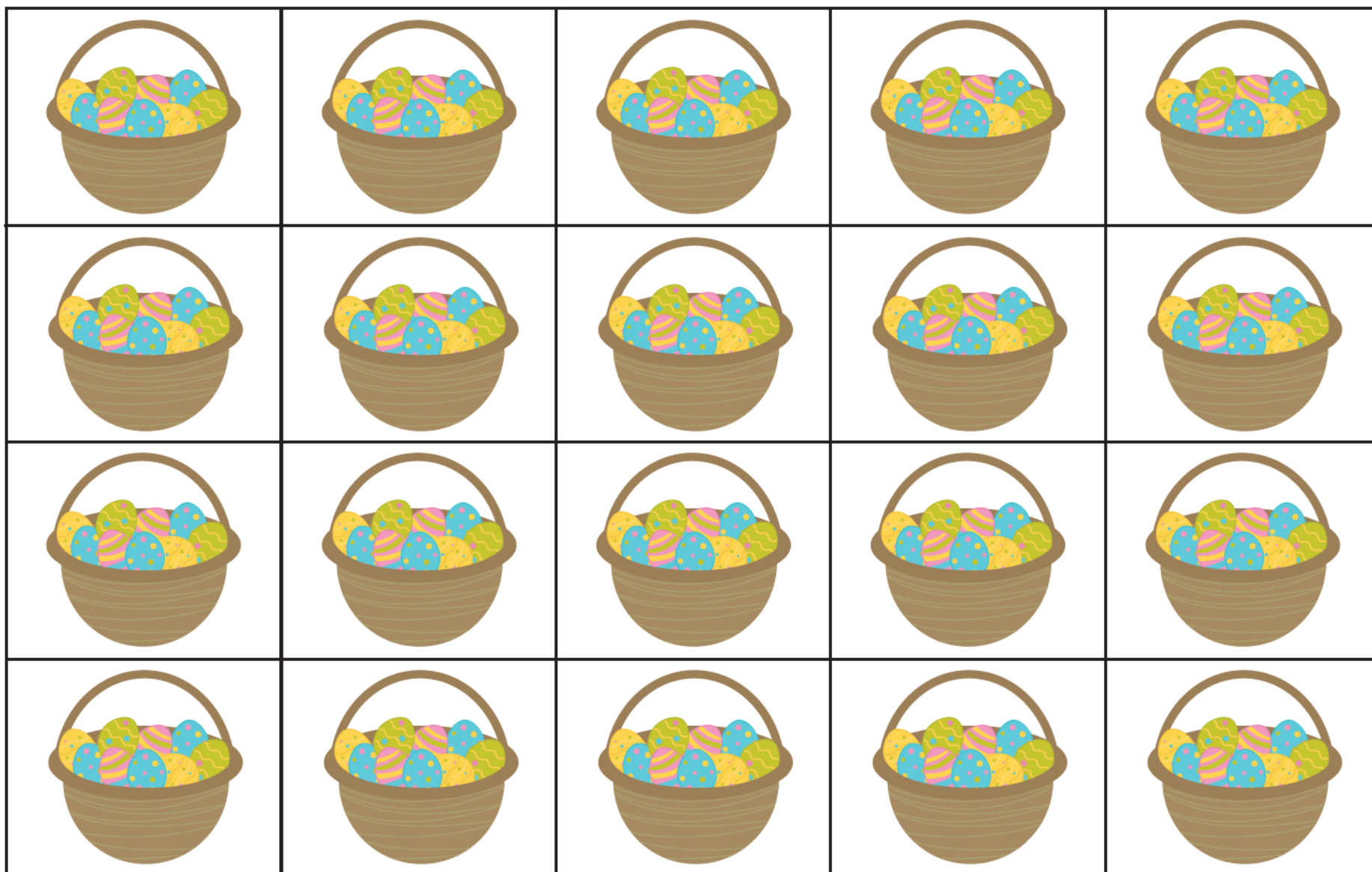
Easter Grid Game v.1

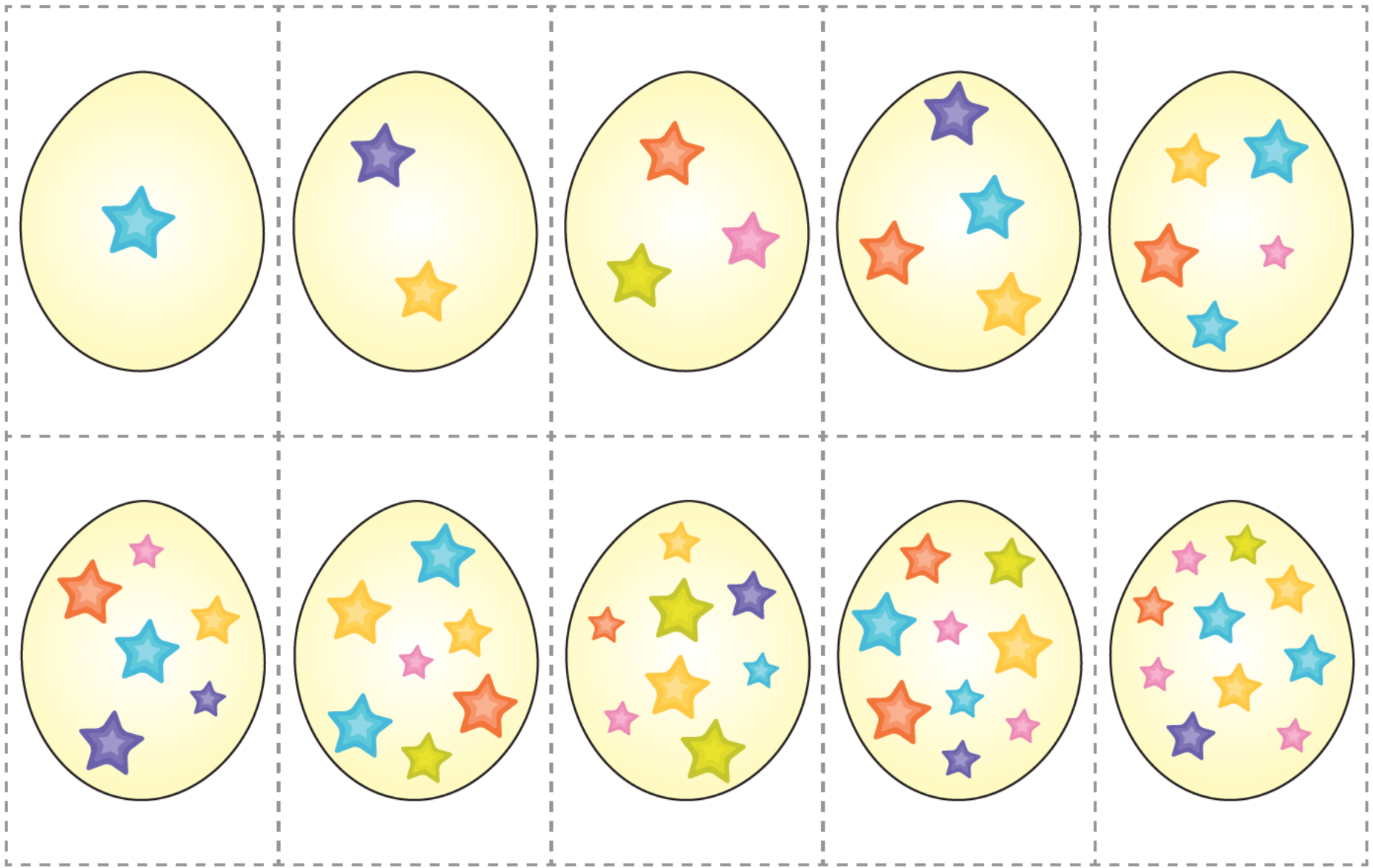

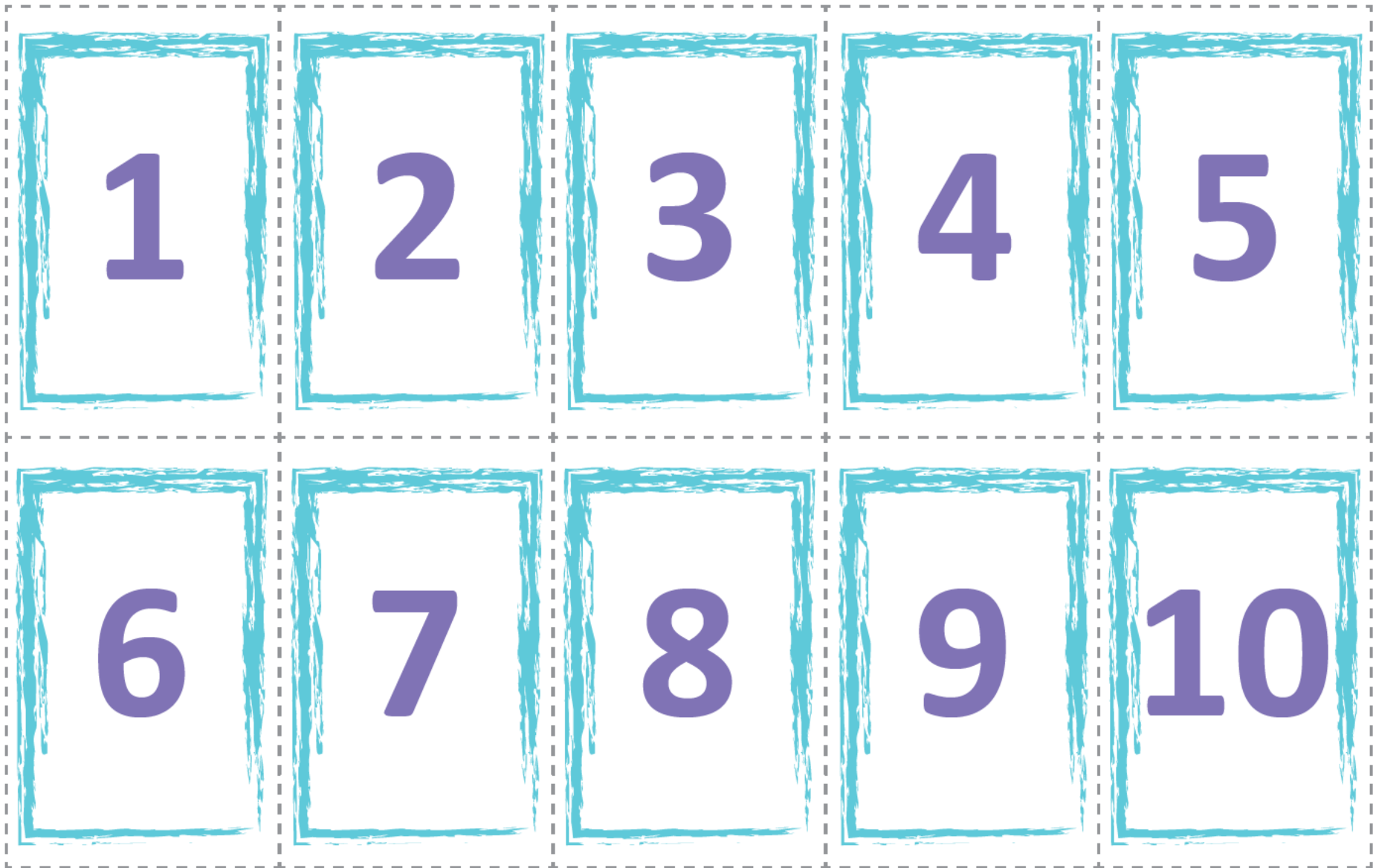

Easter Egg Graphing v.1

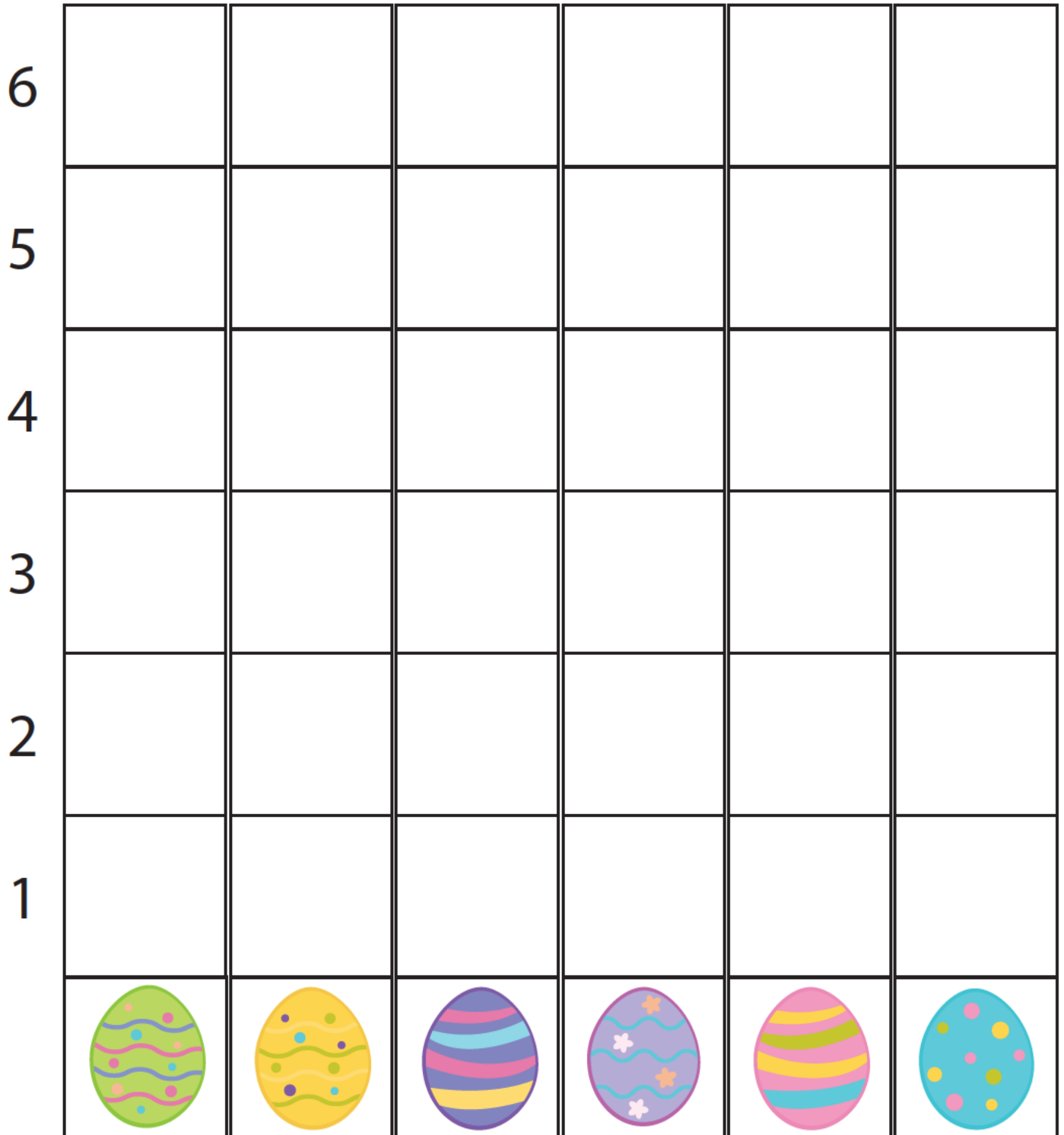

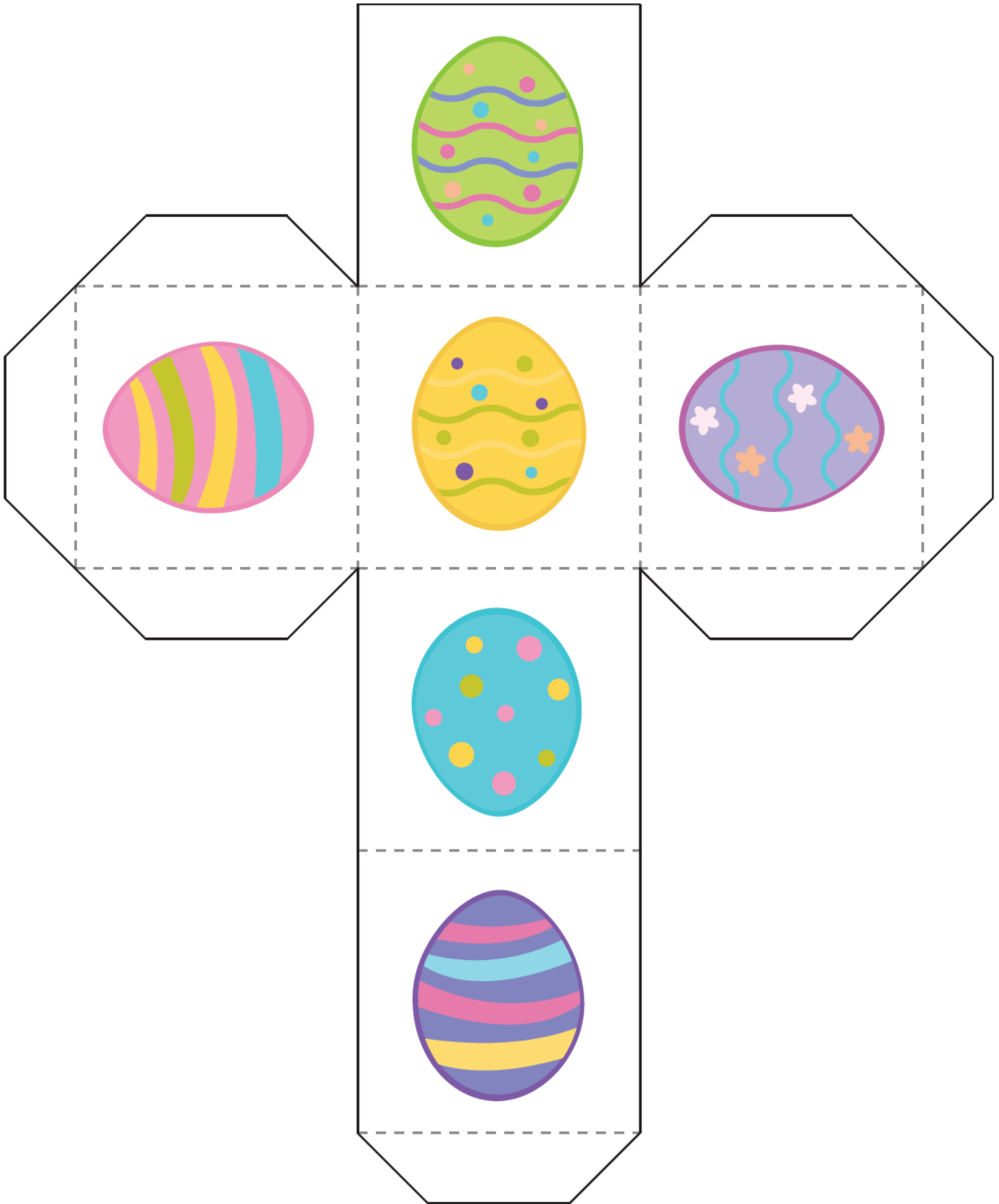


Easter Egg Graphing v.2

Cut out, fold, and tape or glue the dice on the next page. Have your child roll the dice, then place a marker (e.g., button, coin) or use a crayon to fill in the column matching the Easter egg that was rolled. After several rolls of the dice, count how many times each Easter egg was rolled.



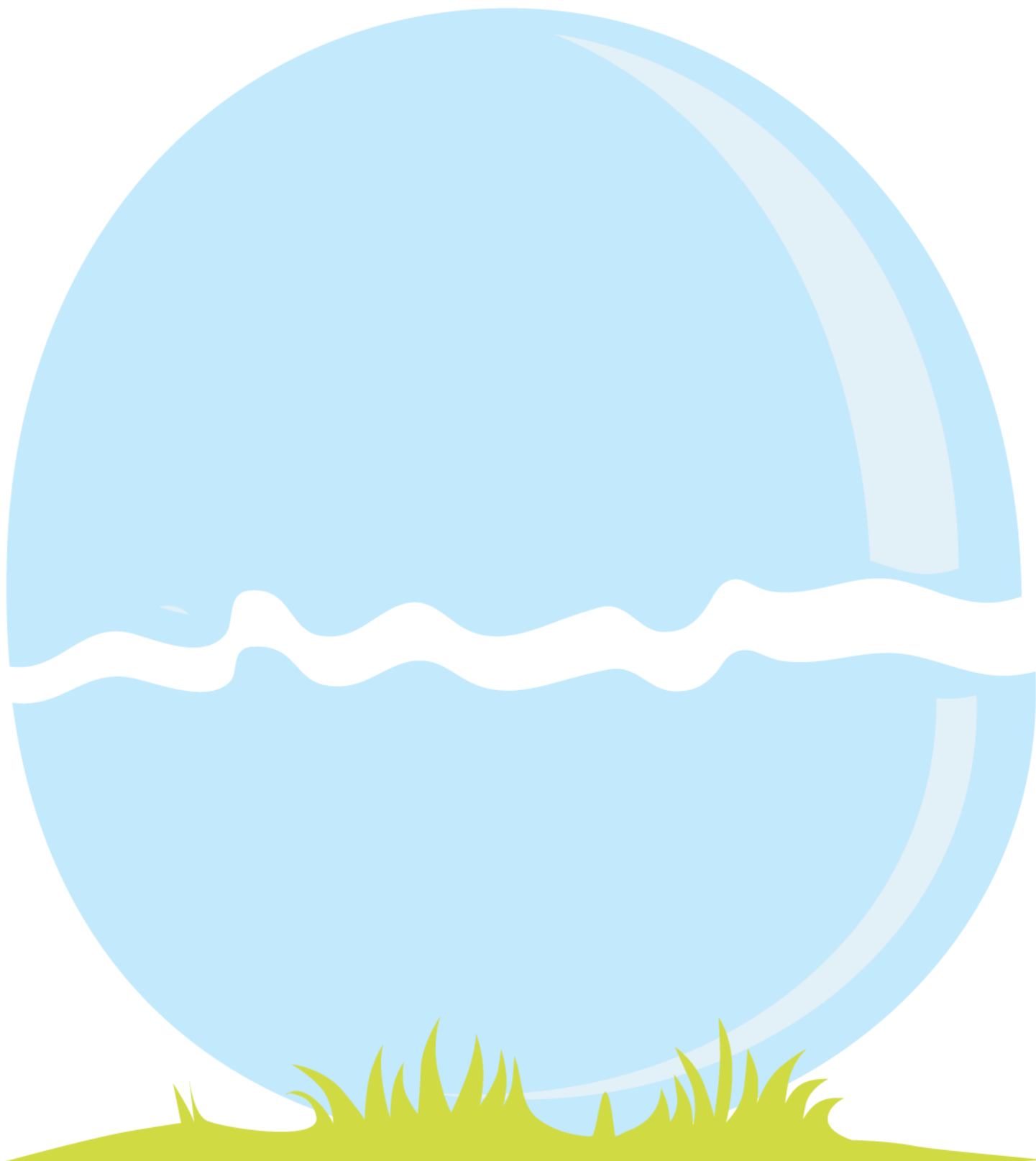
Cut along the solid lines. Fold along the dotted lines. Use glue on flaps to hold dice together.



Easter Egg Dice Math

Materials: 1 dice and 12 beads or buttons.

Directions: Roll the dice. Decorate the top half of the egg with the indicated number of buttons or beads. Roll the dice again, then decorate the bottom half of the egg with the indicated number of buttons or beads. After decorating both halves of the egg, count the total number of buttons or beads.

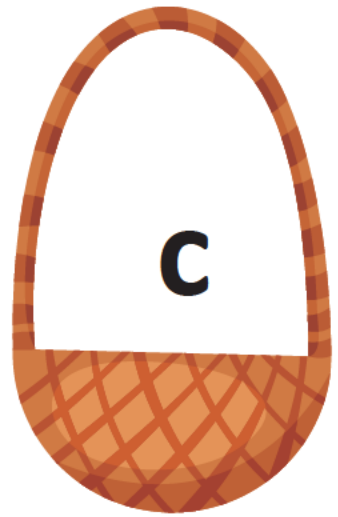
Letter Trail

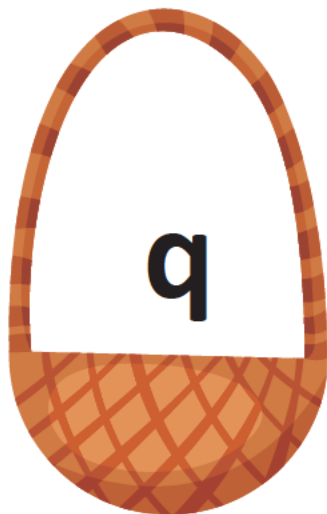

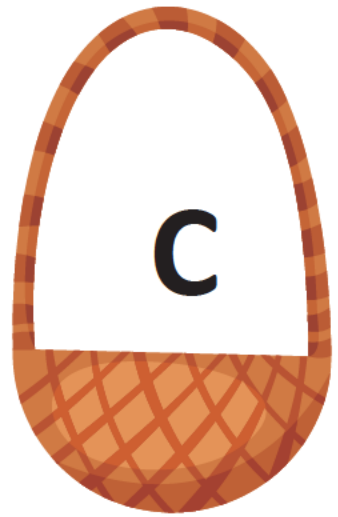
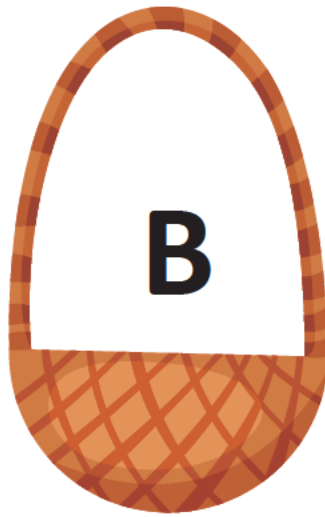






Find the Easter Egg Uppercase Alphabet Activity

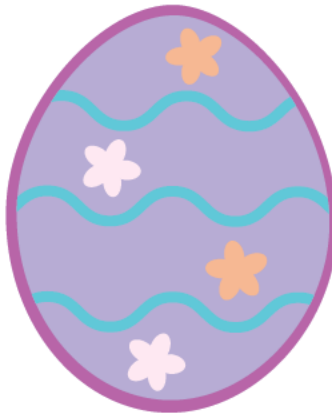
